

**Municipality of the County of Colchester Property Tax Exemption** 

## **DEADLINE - MAY 8, 2009**

Colchester County property owners may be exempt, to a maximum of \$250.00, from the payment of their 2009/2010 property taxes. To qualify, applicants must fall into one of the following categories as outlined in the *Low Income Tax Exemption policy*.

> Family Size **Gross Income Exemption** Less than \$19,000 Single \$150.00 Family of 2 Less than \$25,000 \$200.00 Family of 3 or more Less than \$30,000 \$250.00

Income refers to total gross income from all sources for the calendar year ending December 31, 2008. In your calculation of income, you are required to include the income of all members of the household, except full-time students. However, you should not include income pursuant to the following sources:

- 1. War Veterans Allowance Act (Canada);
- 2. Pension Act (Veterans Affairs Canada);
- 3. Child Tax Benefit; or
- GST Rebate.

To qualify for this exemption, applicants must own and occupy the property. Application forms will automatically be mailed to last year's successful applicants. Otherwise, applications can be obtained from the Colchester County Tax Office at 1 Church Street, Truro or by calling

For income verification purposes, please bring a copy of your 2008 income tax return when applying for the property tax exemption.
