Deed Transfer Tax to Double?

The Municipality of the County of Colchester and the Town of Truro are proposing to double the Deed Transfer Tax charged to homebuyers when they purchase. The increase would see the tax go from 0.5 to one per cent. On an average home purchase of \$150,000, the Deed transfer tax would be \$1500 with the proposed new increase. This amount must be paid in cash on closing and cannot be added into a mortgage amount.

The local real estate brokerages are planning to voice their concerns at the County Council meeting April 30 at 7 p.m. at the County Court House on Church Street, as well as the Town meeting scheduled for May 4. They are encouraging

everyone affected to also attend these meetings or to contact their representatives on Council or their Mayor with their comments or questions.
