

# Dick Lemon Wins TIANS Award

## 2009 Innovator Of The Year Award

The Tourism Industry Association of Nova Scotia (TIANS) has awarded to Dick Lemon, of Five Islands, the 2009 Innovator Of The Year Award. It was present-

ed for his development of a retreat on Long Island, for his creation of the Not Since Moses run and his recent opening of Mo's, a café, book and art store and

hostel in Five Islands. The retreat has been used by groups such as Nova Scotia College of Arts and Design, Kings College, Nova Scotia Symphony and Mt. Allison University. The Not Since Moses run has

doubled in size each of its 3 years and expects to enroll 1500 runners for its August 14, 2010 event.

Mo's hosts local musicians, line dancing, storytelling and special events in its café which features a wood burning oven and all freshly made food.

When presented the award at a Gala Dinner held by TIANS Lemon said: "the greatest asset tourism in Nova Scotia has is its people. Tourists perhaps don't first come here because of that but for sure they return here because of our people. Hospitality comes natural to Nova Scotians because they learn it in the home."
