#### Progressive Conservative government tributed \$800,000 to the program; this year, the NDP government eliminated the program from its budget entirely.

"Good Neighbours allows money to be put back in to the pockets of people who need it," Casey said, adding that it assisted about 1,400 Nova Scotia families last year alone. "I would encourage
