Beekeeping Course Started Jan. 25th


An introductory beekeeping course will be offered starting January 25 at the Great Village Community Centre. The course will be held from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm on Tuesday nights. There will be seven night classes on relevant topics: stings, hive parts, bee biology, bee behaviour, equipment, spring colony management, swarms, nucs and queen rearing, fall management and over-wintering, bee diseases, hive products and the economics of beekeeping.

The course will include lectures, discussions, videos, simulations and guest beekeepers. In May, the class will re-unite on a good day for a six hour "day in the beeyard" working with bees and reinforcing the classroom learnings from the winter sessions.

Participants will be prepared and ready to get and manage hives of their own by the end of the course.

This class has been held five times before under the auspices of the Chignecto Central continuing education program. Since that program was discontinued this year, the Nova Scotia Community College, Truro Campus has adopted the beekeeping course and has advertised it and will be doing the registra-
