MAP # 325 Shows the site of Crowe's mill, located on Bairds Brook, in the hamlet of "Crowes Mills. The first mill on this site was a grist mill, used to grind buckwheat into flour. It was built by James Crowe around 1785. A saw mill was later added and this pond and the adjacent area has been in constant use for the milling and woodworking trades since. The Higgins family acquired the operation from the Crowe family in the early 1880's and have continuously produced lumber products, including windows and sashes, since that time. The 1870's photo shows a spring freshet topping the dam, with an early mill building to the right. Crowes Mills is located just north of highway #2, between Lower and Upper Onslow.

Dick Akerman has been compiling information on behalf of the Colchester Historical Museum Archives, which will be published as a monthly column in the Shoreline Journal.


