Kyle identifies most strongly with the term artist: "art is the only thing that has ever held my interest, in terms of something that could be a potential profession - although that has never been the reason for doing it." Kyle's work has been largely influenced by his everyday reality. Subject matter varies greatly, from "the dramatic to the mundane." Kyle's primary intent is to "addresses the notion that every aspect of life, should be acknowledged, no matter how seemingly insignificant, important, ugly, or beautiful." Henderson also draws inspiration from his interest in the "ideological apparatus" and how it functions and influences our daily



lives: "broadly speaking my work is sometimes awkward, or uncomfortable, with the intent to cause people to question their set-in-stone ideologies, and realize that they are in fact learned."

As March comes to a close we have much

to look forward to in April: The Phantom Returns on March 11th, George Canyon on April 16th, the Spinney Brothers on April 19th, Anne Janelle Davison & James Hill on April 27th, and the final Truro Music Festival concert on April 28th!
