Food From the Heart, developed by the Hospice Society, the Palliative Care Program, and local Sobeys and Foodland stores, is unique to Colchester East-Hants and ensures 100% of all funds raised go directly to families in our communities.

A key component of Hospice services, Food from the Heart has proven to be a crucial program. Serving an average of 10 families per month, Food from the Heart helps to relieve financial pressure experienced by families facing end of life.

An aging population, and greater awareness of Hospice programming, is creating consistent growth in demand. Starting out as a \$3000 program in 2005, Food From the Heart distributed over \$37,000.00 in Food From the Heart cards in 2013-2014.

Our goal for 2014-15 is \$40,000. Thanks to great community support, we are well on our way to reaching our target. The support of the Bible Hill Kinsmen, The Truro Gyro Club, the United Way of Colchester, and the Sisters of Charity, have contributed to our current total of \$11,350.
