

Reunited with Lost Medals

Thirty-two years ago Ed Murphy lost all his service medals from the Second World War during a house fire.

Walter Millen, a local military historian and collector, who attends many Military Collectables Show and Sales, says Mr. Murphy often mentioned the loss of his medals. "He mentioned a couple times if I ever saw a set of medals at the shows to pick them up for him, but when I told him what they would cost, he said for me to never mind, that he didn't need them that bad" says Walter Millen.

he always try's to see if he can find the rightful owner.

The loss of Ed Murphy's medals was something that bothered Millen and when none turned up in the shows, he decided to do something about it. He ordered a set online directly from Ottawa, and had them mounted.

"Bev Morse, mounted the medals for Ed and didn't charge anything. He said it was a gift from one old merchant seaman to another," laughs Walter.

Ed Murphy, who was originally from Newfoundland, served 7 years in the Merchant Navy and the medals he lost included a 1939-45 Service Star, the Atlantic Star, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the Canadian War Medal. Medals are only awarded once in a lifetime and if they are lost or destroyed a recipient must pay \$25 each to replace them.

Walter Millen's daughter Barbara presented the medals to a very emotional Ed Murphy at the Jam Session held at the Great Village Legion on March 6th. He was overjoyed to receive such a wonderful gift.
