36 Organizations Get 50% Insurance Rebate

Council committee agreed to provide \$5,000 in supportive funding for the NS Women that Hunt "Youth Expo" which will be held at the Brookfield Sportsplex on April 22nd. The motion moved by Councillor Stewart and seconded by Councillor MacInnes will see the funds taken from the 2017-2018 Economic Development Budget.

Organizers have targeted youth within the Chignecto-Central School Board and anticipate 1500-2000 youth will attend. The unique event is designed to expose youth of all ages to new activities related to the outdoors, fitness, art, community programs, and overall better health and wellness. Expo is interactive guided by professionals and

experts in various fields in an effort to expose, educate and inspire. Admission for kids is free, while adults pay \$5.00. In its first year attendance was 1,110 youth and 574 adults. It's current event poster has been viewed by 6.9-Million people on Facebook.

ON motion by Tom Taggart staff have been given approval to negotiate, and if they feel comfortable to ask the CAO to sign a contract with True North Tax, a firm who has conducted reviews of other municipalities in the Maritimes with regard to an HST review. The company does the review without any upfront cost to the municipality, but take 40% of any rebate obtained from Canada Revenue Agency. Should CRA

claw back and amounts from the review, True North Tax would refund the municipality.

Council approved a list of tax write offs amounting to \$5,952.97, most of which involved mobile homes that have been demolished or removed. Council is expected to review policy on mobile homes to see if trailer park owners who lease the lots could be held liable for the outstanding taxes.

A \$65,800 contract was awarded to J. R. Eisener Contracting for upgrades to the Parkwood Drive pumping station in Truro Heights. An additional \$12,820 is added to the cost of the project to cover staff time, (\$5,000); rebated tax, (\$2,820) and design fees (\$5,000).

Over the past five years, the number of non-profit organizations qualifying for 50% rebate on insurance costs has increased to 36 for the March allocation with a number which come forward in October would put the annual \$18,000 budget in deficit by over \$3,000. As a result council authorized the addition of \$3,000 to the upcoming budget, which permitted approval of the 36 applicants totaling \$13,588.
