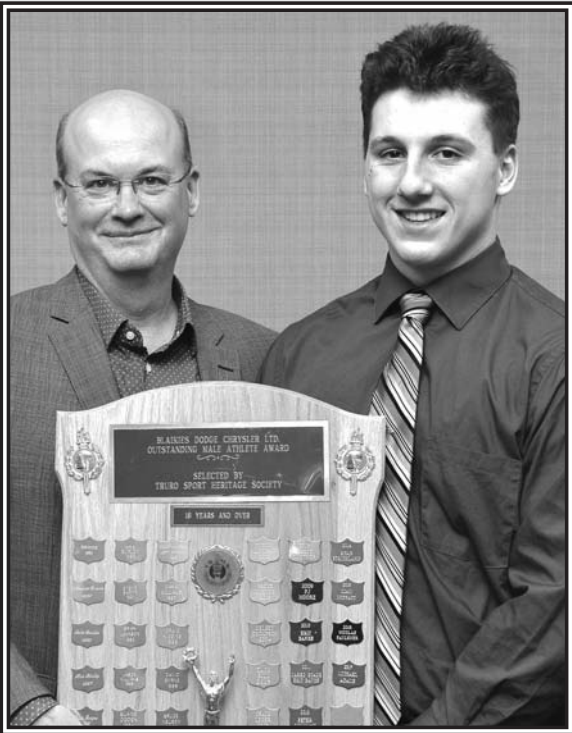

Busy Season for Public Works

In a report to Colchester Council, Michelle Newell, Director of Public Works indicated 2018 is expected to be a busy year with many projects on the 2018 roster. The new Debert Water tower and associated work will be ongoing along with Headworks Upgrade at the Central Colchester Wastewater Facility also ongoing.

Other projects include: Carter Road Sidewalk, contract already signed; Spruce Drive Sidewalk Replacement, cur-

rently out to tender; Pleasant Valley Road/Hwy 289 Sidewalk; Repaving, Hidden Valley Drive, Phase 1; Village Line Sidewalk a joint project with the Village of Bible Hill and expansion to the public works garage in Lower Truro.

Work in the Debert area will include: Debert Sewage Treatment Plant 2 Elimination; Roof Replacement, Debert Industrial Mall; New Well - Debert Water Utility and MacElmon Road Roundabout, pending Archaeological Clearance.
