### Modernizing MGA to Benefit Nova Scotians

Amendments to the Municipal Government Act and the Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM) Charter will mean municipalities will no longer require a legislative change to approve spending for a new purpose. Currently, municipalities can only spend on items that are included on a list in the Municipal Government Act. If they wish to spend on goods or services which are not on this list, they require a legislative amendment. This can restrict the services a municipality can offer, or activities they can be involved in and prevent them from making decisions in a timely manner. This change will remove the list from the act and the charter so that municipalities can more readily respond to priorities. Municipalities remain accountable to their residents for how municipal finances are spent and are still required to spend within the budget that has been approved by council. All other legislated requirements for municipal spending remain in place to ensure fiscal responsibility and accountability is maintained at the municipal level.

### \$2.4 Million to create 750 new spaces

Children and families will have improved access to child care from a \$2.4 million investment that will create more than 750 new spaces. Thirteen regulated child care centres and 14 regulated family home child care agencies were awarded \$2.4 million in Strategic Growth Initiative funding although none of the funding was allocated to facilities in Cumberland and Colchester Counties. Funding for these spaces and other investments come from a three-year, \$35 million early learning and child care funding agreement with the federal government that was signed in January 2018. The child care sector will also have access to another \$5.9 million that will help it grow and meet the needs of the communities it serves. 2,245 new spaces since 2014. Between March and September 2018, child care centres applied to receive Strategic Growth Initiative funding. As a result, 13 operators will receive a total of \$695,000 to expand or open 455 new child care spaces in eight regions, with \$1.1 million remaining for them to help with annual operating costs. Fourteen regulated family home child care agencies will receive \$372,000 to create and sustain 301 new spaces through the addition of 43 approved family home child care sites, with \$227,000 remaining for them to help with annual operating costs.

### Jordyn Henderson, Truro gets Silver Medal

Jordyn Henderson, Truro teamed up with Tia Wamboldt, Bridgewater to capture a silver medal for trampoline duo at the 2019 Canada Winter Games in Red Deer, Alta. Team Nova Scotia garnered 11 medals across eight different sports. In week one of the games, Nova Scotia earned three medals: silver for boxer Alex Bulgaru, Halifax; a bronze for the artistic gymnastics team of Christopher Bearn, Halifax; Matthew Brown, Dartmouth; Vincent d'Entremont, Hebbville, Lunenburg Co.; Landon Duquette, Middle Sackville; Andrew Gallant, Dartmouth; and Alex Watters, Williamswood and a bronze for boxer Matthew Ross, New Waterford. Week two saw Nova Scotia collect eight medals: gold for alpine skier Shane Sommer; silver for para-alpine skier Brenda MacDonald, Granville Ferry; a silver for Special Olympic figure skater Scott Denyes, Beaver Bank; silver for judoka Sierra Tanner, Halifax; silver for Special Olympic figure skater Jessica Cranton, Annapolis Royal; bronze for squash player Douglas Kosciukiewicz, Canaan, Kings Co.; bronze for curlers Cally Moore, Cassidy Currie, Cate Fitzgerald and Taylour Stevens, plus the Henderson-Wamboldt duo on trampoline. Team Nova Scotia also had a number of top five placements including: fourth place for boxer Matthew Fraser, Antigonish; artistic gymnast Alex Watters; snowboarder Kate MacKinnon, Chester; trampolinists Kai Dwyer, Fall River; Carson Langille, Halifax; Tia Wamboldt, Bridgewater; and Jordyn Henderson, Truro, para-alpine skier Brenda MacDonald and alpine skier Cole Fraser, Bedford. Fifth place for artistic gymnast Alex Watters, boxer Matt MacDonald, Sydney Mines; badminton player Miklos Kanyasi, Wolfville; judoka Emilie Townsend, Middleton; and archer Siyoon Kim, Halifax.
