The Nova Scotia Museum system consists of 28 museum sites and is one of the oldest provincial systems in the country. It is responsible for the provincial collection

of over one million artifacts and specimens. It also oversees the stewardship of more than 210 buildings, four floating vessels and nine locomotives.

The collection provides Nova Scotians with a rich resource for conducting research, educational programs, exhibit development, and reflects the incredible diversity of Nova Scotia's human and nat-
