



Welcome to Spring Lightshow Continues until April 21

For the past nine months the Chamber has been working on a massive community-building project with our many partners across the county.

This ACOA funded project was focused on boosting consumer confidence as we emerged from the pandemic and giving people opportunities to visit storefronts again to support small business as they returned to main street shopping areas.

One of the last parts of this project for us to complete was hosting a Welcome to Spring -

Butterfly and Blossom Celebration at the Truro Farmers' Market on March 21, adjacent to the Civic Square.

This area was fluttering with a kaleidoscope of activity for the whole evening as we awaited dusk to mark the official launch of a spring-themed lightshow appearing on the Colchester East Hants Regional Library. The Chamber and Downtown Truro Partnership staff, and volunteers, greeted more than 250 people at the market, offered butterfly cookies and refreshments, music, selfie backgrounds, butterfly dancers, colouring pages

and complimentary butterfly wings to the first 130 arrivals.

As a first-time event, we were overwhelmed by the response by the community wanting to celebrate spring with us. We chose to focus this project around butterflies as a symbol of renewal and hope as we emerged from more than two-years of a pandemic. We quickly learned that butterflies, and their beauty unite people from around the globe. Butterflies are found in every habitat around the world, from tropical forests to open grasslands, to Arctic tundra and on every continent except Antarctica.

Nearly every person, no matter where your origins, have witnessed the spring return of butterflies.

This event was an exceptional example of the diverse multi-cultural representation of community, united by butterflies. It was an absolute delight for us, as the organizers, to welcome dozens of newcomers to our area and share this celebration of community. It was also very heartwarming to see people of all ages from babies to seniors, colouring butterflies and dancing with sparkling wings.

As the sun went down and the light show launched even more people arrived to watch. We are excited to share that the lightshow will be ex-

tended for viewing and will be cast daily from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m. until April 21.

This spring-themed lightshow transitions from winter to spring with colourful animations set to music that highlight our strong tie to agriculture, tourism, the tidal bore and Victoria Park. It also recognizes that the North America Indigenous Games will be held in Nova Scotia in July with the archery portion of the games hosted in Millbrook First Nation.




