As Chief of Protocol, she coordinated Queen Elizabeth II's Royal Visit to Nunavut in 2002. Annette was appointed, by the Queen, as a Member of the Royal Victorian Order (MVO), which recognizes extraordinary, important, or personal services to members of the Royal Family. She was also the recipient of the Queen's Gold and Platinum Jubilee medals. Annette eventually moved back to the East Coast where she and her husband were raising their family. The family is grateful to the Palliative Care team, the nurses and doctors at the Nova Scotia Cancer Center, the Victoria General Hospital, the Colchester East Hants Health Centre, and nurses and home care at the Victorian Order of Nurses.
