Great Village Historical Society Notes

The June monthly meeting was held on June 2 at the Legion Hall. On June 12 members Logan Spencer and Murray Giddens travelled to Tatamagouche area to see the launching of the 45-foot skipjack which our Historical Society had viewed under construction last June. The vessel was a project begun by Bob Cooper of Great Village and was completed by Tam Flemming of Balfron.

On June 14 the Historical Society traveled to Truro for a tour of the Colchester Museum and Archives. We were given enthusiastic presentations by three dedicated volunteer researchers. Carol Campbell showed us a cane, carefully wrapped in tissue paper, which had belonged to Rev. David Smith, who arrived in Londonderry Township in 1770 to become the Presbyterian pastor at Masstown and Folleigh. Documents on file describe the

cane which Rev. Smith bought at an auction in 1774.

Wearing white gloves, Carol showed us another valued artifact, Lawrence Peppard's notebook, dating to 1767. Since money was seldom used to settle accounts in those days, most people kept a record of the exchange of goods and services, recording it carefully in a small notebook.

Jim Smith described the arrival of the Planters from New England and Northern Ireland, who settled the Township Londonderry which stretched from Chiganois River to Little Bass River. The original handwritten document which lists the Londonderry Grantees of 1765 is preserved in the Colchester Archives. As a souvenir of our trip, we were given a transcribed copy of this grant as well as a photocopy of a page of Lawrence Peppard's notebook.

Richard Akerman brought

other area artifacts to our attention, including Dr. Lawrence Peppard's Diary, dated about 1865. Thousands of letters and documents relating to the history of our area are filed in boxes and carefully preserved.

We descended to the ground level to view the new exhibit of "Horse Power to Horsepower", the story of the automobile in Colchester County. A side room is filled with a display relating to the Planters.

Our tour was completed with a delicious meal at the Palliser Restaurant.
