Low Fat Wild Blueberry Muffins

3 1/2 c. flour

1 Tbsp. baking powder 1/2 tsp. baking soda

Vz tsp. salt

2 eggs, beaten 1/2 c. vegetable oil

1/2 c. brown sugar 1 % c. unsweetened applesauce

Vi c. wild blueberries V₂ c. cranberries, chopped (optional)

¼ c. brown sugar (2nd amount) Preheat oven to 375°F. Sift flour baking powder, soda and salt into a

large mixing bowl. In a separate bowl, whisk together eggs, oil, brown sugar and applesauce; add to dry ingredients and mix until just blended. Fold berries into the batter and pour into prepared muffin tins, filling two-thirds full. Sprinkle tops with brown sugar (2nd amount) and bake for 20-25 minutes, until they are lightly browned and a toothpick inserted in centre comes out clean. Yields 18 large or 24 medium muffins.

Wild Blueberry Grunt

Sauce: 4 c. wild blueberries Dumplings: 2 c. flour 1/2 tsp. nutmed 1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. cinnamon 1 Tosp, sugar 4 c. sugar

1 Tbsp. lemon juice 4 tsp. baking powder 2 Tbsp. butter or shortening

Heat berries, spices, sugar, lemon juice & water in a skillet; boil gently until well blended & slightly cooked down. Sift flour, baking powder, salt & sugar into a bowl. Cut in butter and add enough milk to make a soft biscuit dough. Drop by spoonfuls into hot berry sauce. Cover tightly with a lid and simmer for 15 minutes (no peeking!). The dumplings should be puffed and well cooked through. Transfer cooked dumplings to serving dishes. Ladle sauce over top; serve with whipped cream or ice cream. Yield: 6-8 servings
