December, 2006 (Vol. 10, No. 12) - More than 500 people "Rally for Troops" in Victoria Park, Truro. Old Fashioned Christmas held at Bass River Heritage Museum. Five Islands and District Fire Brigade hold Open House to show residents their new external defibrillator and new Rescue Vehicle, MLA Karen Casey presents Brigade with a \$6000 cheque toward the new equipment.

January, 2007 (Vol. 11, No. 1) - Glenholme Community Group often wrote letters to Service Men and Women during WWII. Serena Lewis appointed as first Executive Director of Hospice Society. Annual Family Literacy Day celebration in Bass River a huge success. Great Village to become an Innovative Learning Community.

February, 2007 (Vol. 11, No. 2) - Six years since Donna Benoit took over The Shoreline Journal. WCCS students painted a group of HUGS, small wooden cutouts made by Gerald Shearer and given to family members or individuals living with, or dying of, a terminal illness. Daylight saving time starting three weeks earlier and last one week later in the fall. Five Island's benefit concert for Doug Dowe raises over \$3000.

April, 2007 (Vol. 11, No. 4) - Legion Branch #72 commemorates 90th Anniversary Of Vimy Ridge with ceremony at St. James United Church. Three levels of government agree to terms for transfer of Debert lands from provincial ownership to a local, municipally owned industrial park. CALA sponsors Bullying Workshop in Bass River. Volunteers unveil plans for Living Veterans Memorial Park in Bass River. Great Village Fire Chief David Lundie recognized for 50 Years of Service.

May, 2007 (Vol. 11, No. 5) - New "Boys Rock" Program in the works for Debert. Brent York of Five Islands and Julia McLellan of Bass River played leading roles in CEC's performance of High School Musical. New Christian Fellowship Center under construction on Plains Rd., Debert.

June, 2007 (Vol. 11, No. 6) - Chiganois Elementary receives \$150,000 Indigo Love of Reading Award. Chiganois Principal Michael Sherren retires after 35 years with CCRSB. Royal Canadian Legion Medal of Excellence presented to Chief Warrant Officer Alysse Taggart, of Bass River.

July, 2007 (Vol. 11, No. 7) - New Farmer's Market opens in Great Village. WCCS students paint new panels for the Bass River Heritage Park kiosk.
