A farewell service for Rev. Brian DeLong, Minister of the Wentworth United Church, and his wife Debbi was held consisting of a supper, a church service, fellowship and entertainment on the last Sunday of June. Although the Wentworth congregation is sad to see Rev DeLong and Debbi DeLong leave, the United Church Women who organized the supper, fellowship, and entertainment took care to have the departure viewed as one of good wishes for the DeLongs.

At 5 p.m. a large crowd attended in the church downstairs beneath the sanctuary. The supper was planned and organized by the United Church Women, headed by President Marie Duranceau and her volunteer work crew.

A church service was held in the sanctuary from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. During the church service, Rev. Brian DeLong preached his last sermon in Wentworth. In addition to

those attending from Wentworth, members from another charge where Rev. DeLong had served were at the meal and at the service to say good-bye to him as well.

After the church service, everyone was invited downstairs for dessert and ice-cream. As well, two singers called the "Double Pleasure" were introduced by Marie Duranceau: talented Beverly Forsythe and Sally Jennings who sang with passion, clarity, and beauty while playing their guitars.

He was ordained as a United Church Minister by the Maritime Conference on May 26, 1974. Following official retirement in 2011, Brian served as retired supply to the Wentworth pastoral charge in N.S. for three years.
