

2014 Wilson Family Scholarship Awarded to 9 Students

Since 2009 the Wilson Family scholarship has awarded nearly \$200,000 in scholarships and gas cards. \$150,000 in scholarships and \$48,000 in gas cards have been received to those selected in the five year history of the program.

A reception was held at the Holiday Inn on July 9th for recipients of the 2014 Wilson Family Scholarship. This was the 5th anniversary for the scholarship, which began in 2009 as part of the Wilsons 100 year celebrations. The scholarship is now awarded annually to nine individuals, in memory of Jonathan MacIntyre, son of Linda McGill, long time employee of Wilsons, who died in a tragic accident last year.

There have been 175 applicants since 2009 from all

four Atlantic Provinces with a total of \$150,000 awarded in scholarships, plus an additional \$48,000 in gas cards awarded to all scholarship applicants.
