Assistance for Accessible Transportation

Rural transit services will receive assistance under the Accessible Transportation Assistance Program to buy or convert vehicles for accessible transportation in a \$366,000 announcement made on July 15th by Municipal Affairs Minister, Mark Furey.

This funding will provide new vehicles for nine community transportation organizations across the province. The program provides up to two-thirds of eligible costs, to a maximum of \$70,000 for new vehicles and \$15,000 for used vehicles.




Stacy Montgomery
