Molson Canadian 2016 Nova Scotia Music Week will be held in Truro November 3-6. Music Nova Scotia is accepting applications for music and industry award nominations until Wednesday, August 3 at 5:00 p.m. ADT. No extensions will be given so all applications must be in on time. Visits to NovaScotia.com in 2016 surpassed the two million mark by the end of June. Year to date website traffic is up 19.1 per cent over the same period in 2015, and page views are up 28 per cent year to date over 2015.

The Nova Scotia Department of Business (NS-DoB) is preparing to conduct a competitive procurement process to select a vendor/team to design high speed internet solution(s) for rural Nova Scotia. NS-DoB is seeking feedback to the draft RFP from interested vendors. NS-DoB held a briefing session on Monday, July 25th in Halifax to present the draft RFP and outline the process for obtaining vendor feedback. Vendors participating in the DRAFT RFP review process will have a minimum of 30 calendar days from release of the DRAFT RFP to the RFP Closing Date to prepare and submit their proposals. Vendors who do not participate in the DRAFT RFP review process will have a minimum of 21 calendar days to prepare and submit their proposals following the formal release of the final RFP.

Unemployed Nova Scotians returning to the classroom to upgrade their skills will get more support this fall. Government is increasing support for living expenses, child care and dependent care for eligible participants of the Skills Development program for the 2016/17 school year. Specific changes are: \$300 per week in living allowance for single clients, up from \$200; \$400 per week in living allowance for clients with dependents, up from \$350 and \$100 per week, per child or dependent, for care, up from \$100 per week per family. Changes to the program, which take effect Sept. 1, will help make post-secondary study more accessible to more Nova Scotians.

Government is supporting Nova Scotia's seafood processing industry by unveiling educational tools to highlight and promote the industry and encourage employment growth. The Department of Fisheries and Aquaculture, in partnership with the Department of Labour and Advanced Education, worked with the seafood processing industry on the \$30,000 project. Along with the videos, it includes a website and infographic cards. Nova Scotia is Canada's largest exporter of fresh seafood with exports valued at \$1.68 billion. Karen Casey, Minister Education and Early Childhood Development, on behalf of Tony Ince, Minister of Communities, Culture and Heritage, on July 9th announced six grants totalling \$127,500 through the Recreation Facility Development Program. Grants for three other projects receiving \$122,500 will be announced at a later date bringing the total for the Fundy region to \$250,000. The Tatamagouche Area Trails Association will use \$12,000 to repair the Waugh River bridge and extend the crusher sand surface from the Highway 6 crossing east of the village to the Sutherland Steam Mill Museum in Denmark. The grants help community groups, municipalities and other not-for-profit organizations develop facilities to increase public participation in sport and physical
