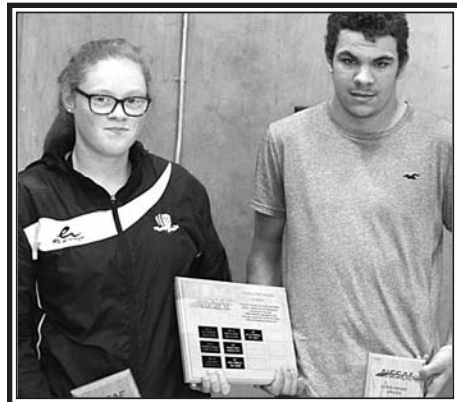

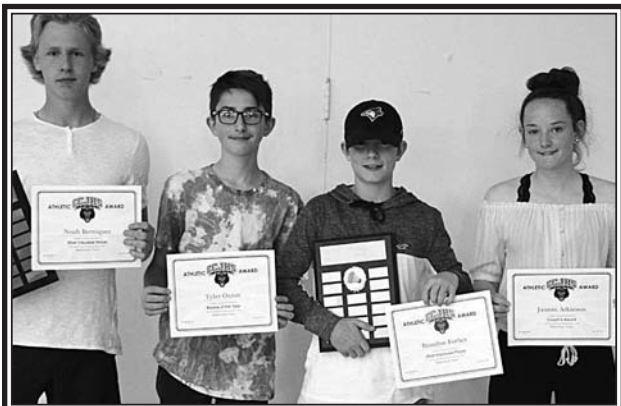

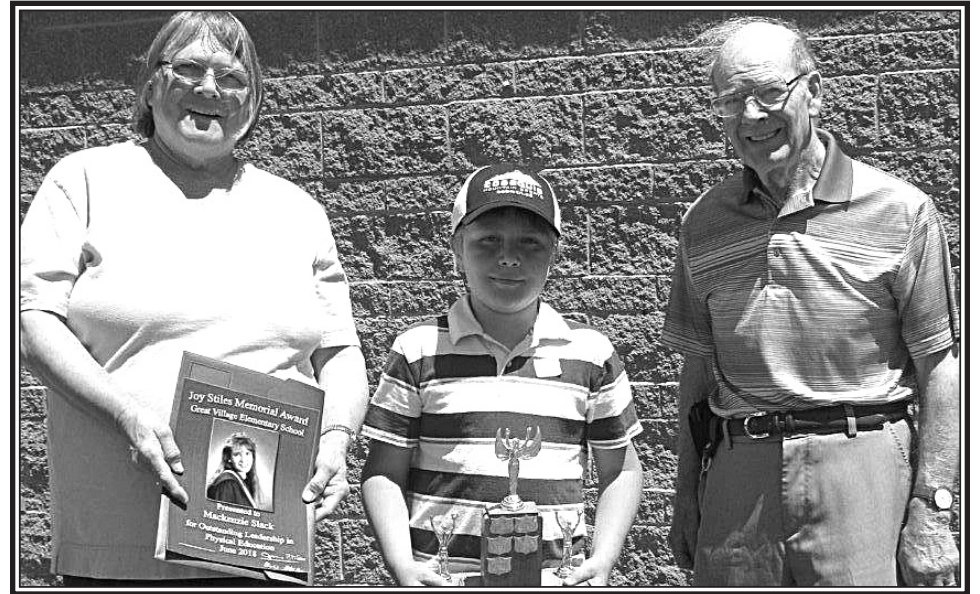

Oxford Frozen Foods to get Innovation Rebate
Nova Scotia Business Inc. (NSBI) has approved a business development incentive in the form of an innovation rebate for Oxford Frozen Foods. Oxford Frozen Foods is the world's largest supplier of quality frozen wild blueberries and Canada's premier processor of frozen carrot products. The Oxford-based operation is proceeding with a \$2.82 million total capital investment to implement state of the art product sorting equipment, using digital and visual systems, to provide enhanced sorting capabilities and increase production capacity. The company has been approved for a maximum rebate of \$702,205 upon completion of its project, based on eligible Nova Scotia capital spending of \$2.80 million.

10 new medical residencies created
The Colchester East Hants Health Centre in Truro will become home to a new northern zone training site for six of the residencies, which were announced by Health and Wellness Minister Randy Delorey. Although the residency training program will be based out of the Truro hospital, two of the residents will work with doctors in that area while two will work in Amherst and two in New Glasgow. The new residency spaces, which go into effect next July, will be for two-year terms. During that period, the residents will work in family doctor practices with their patients to gain skills in such areas as maternal care, psychiatry and geriatrics. When the program is fully subscribed, the province will be spending \$3.3 million on the new site and additional spaces. Dr. Deanna Field, a family medicine and emergency room doctor based out of the Colchester East Hants Health Centre will serve as the director of the new North Nova Family Medicine Teaching site, as it is to be known. In addition to the six spaces being created in the northern zone, two will be added to an existing site in Cape Breton and one will be added to a site in South West Nova. A 10th position will be used for family medicine residents to gain additional clinical experience in an area that would enhance services in the community, such as mental health and addictions or oncology.
