ing. The maximum benefit will be \$6,639 per child under age 6, and \$5,602 per child aged 6 through 17. For example, a single mother with two children under the age of 6 and an income of \$30,000 will receive an additional \$286 tax-free for the upcoming benefit year. This means up to \$13,278 in support every year.

Wildfire Crew sent to Ontario

A 21-person crew of wildfire fighters departed Halifax on July 5. They returned home on Sunday, July 21st after spending time on the fireline near Thunder Bay. Nova Scotia's assistance was requested through the Canadian Interagency Forest Fire Centre. In May, Nova Scotia sent 21 firefighters to help fight wildfires in Alberta.

Name Change Fees Waived

Government is making it easier for Residential School survivors and their families to reclaim their birth name. For many Indigenous children entering residential schools, the process of removing their cultural identities began by replacing aboriginal names with Euro-Canadian names. Fees will be waived for residential school survivors and their families who want to reclaim names that were changed by the residential school system. Currently, the fee to change a name is \$165.70 and an additional \$24.95 for each family member. The fee for a long form birth certificate is \$39.90. The fees will be waived for five years until July 2024.

Property Tax Rebate to Benefit Seniors

Low-income seniors will be able to afford to stay in their homes longer, thanks to the Property Tax Rebate for Seniors. Eligible seniors receive a rebate on municipal property taxes paid during the previous tax year, to a maximum of \$800. Government introduced two changes to the program this year: seniors who moved out of their home in 2018 now qualify for the rebate, as long as they paid last year's municipal taxes; seniors who receive the rebate can choose to be automatically considered for the 2019-20 Heating Assistance Rebate Program in the fall. The heating assistance program issues eligible applicants rebates of up to \$200. Approximately 15,500 seniors benefit from the Property Tax Rebate Program each year. Seniors qualify for the program if they are receiving the Guaranteed Income Supplement or the Allowance from Service Canada in 2019, and their 2018 residential property tax bills are in their name and paid in full. Reduce Trade Barriers and Increase Efficiency

Nova Scotia continues to be a national leader in eliminating internal trade barriers and reducing red tape. Government's goal of helping businesses save \$25 million annually through reduced regulatory burden was exceeded, reaching \$34 million by the end of 2018. A new target has now been set - to reduce overall regulatory burden on businesses by nearly \$45 million annually between 2017 and 2020. By the end of this year, 10 reconciliation agreements will be finalized to resolve regulatory differences nationally in the areas of occupational health and safety, transportation, techni-
