Construction and Demolition Disposal By-law Amendments

A Special Session of the Municipal Council of the Municipality of the County of Colchester on June 18th, lead to another special session of council on July 4th. The session on Tuesday, June 18, 2019 at 4:00 pm to consider First Reading of amendments to Chapter 57 - Construction and Demolition Disposal By-law; and to discuss and consider First Reading of a new Disposal of Hazardous Substances By-law. Second reading was held during the July 4th special session.

Dennis James, Municipal Solicitor provided a summary of the proposed substantive amendments to Chapter 57 - Construction and Demolition (C&D) Disposal By-law which included an expansion of the title and scope of the Bylaw; inclusion of definition of hazardous substances; a clause which would preclude receipt of hazardous substances; a clause providing financial security for liability; increase fines for potential

offences; and, providing effective date and intended application to existing C&D sites.

In a somewhat related matter, council had asked Nova Scotia Department of Environment to delay any approvals before it concerning a C&D site in Middle Stewiacke for the purpose of disposal of asbestos because the county was in the process of updating and revising its by-laws for the same purpose.

In a rush to complete their by-law revisions Colchester Council held a special session of council on Wednesday, July 4th in council chambers at 4:00 pm for the purpose of second reading.

The newly proposed Chapter 58 - Disposal of Hazardous Substances By-law would require a permit for businesses seeking to receive hazardous substances for the purposes of disposal and allow Council to limit the location of where disposal sites can exist.

The First Reading is to announce Council's intention to con-

sider adopting the amendments to the existing Chapter 57 - Construction and Demolition (C&D) Disposal By-law and the newly proposed Chapter 58 - Disposal of Hazardous Substances By-law. During the second reading Council will have opportunity to debate the merits of the By-law, as well as hear any concerns of the public.

Moved by Deputy Mayor Stewart and Seconded by Councillor Gregory Council approved, by way of First Reading, amendments to Chapter 57 - Construction and Demolition Disposal By-law and the new Chapter 58 - Disposal of Hazardous Substances By-law, as presented."

During the same special session council approved it approved a committee recommendation on the Internet Broadband Request for Expression of Interest, which was reported earlier in the July issue of the Shoreline.
