WILD BLUEBERRY CRISP

Preheat oven to 375°F.
Grease an 8x8 inch square baking dish.

Cream together:

1/3 c. butter or margarine
1 1/4 c. lightly packed brown sugar
Stir in until crumbly a mixture of:
1/3 c. all purpose flour
2/3 c. rolled oats
1/4 tsp. cinnamon

Arrange in prepared dish:

3-4 c. wild blueberries (fresh or frozen) Sprinkle with crumbs. Bake in preheated 375°F oven for 40 minutes or until topping is golden brown. Makes 6 servings.

Wild Blueberry Recipe



WILD BLUEBERRY JAM

4 1/2 c. fresh wild blueberries
1/3 c. lime juice
1/2 c. water
1 Tbsp. grated lime rind - optional
1 pkg. powdered fruit pectin
4 c. sugar



In a large pan, combine the blueberries, lime juice, water, pectin and lime rind. Bring to a rolling boil over high heat, stirring constantly. Stir in the sugar and while constantly stirring, bring to rolling boil again. Keep at a hard boil for 1 minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and skim foam from top if needed. Quickly spoon into clean jars and seal.
