Communities Receive Boost for Public Transportation

The province is investing \$4.7 million to improve access to public transportation across Nova Scotia. Twenty-five projects will receive funding through the Community Transportation Assistance Program and the Public Transit Assistance Program this fiscal year.

The Community Transportation Assistance Program is providing more than \$1.8 million in operating funding to 19 door-to-door community transportation services. In northern Nova Scotia two Community Transportation Assistance Program grants were announced. The recipients were: Colchester Transportation Cooperative Ltd., \$172,492 and Cumberland County Transportation Society, \$146,360.

The Public Transit Assistance Program is providing \$2,925,000 to municipalities and community organizations providing fixed route transit services. The funding is used towards capital purchases such as new buses.

Consultation Begins on Coastal Protection Act

Nova Scotians concerned about coastal development can now share their thoughts on proposed rules that will determine what can and cannot be built on the province's vulnerable coastlines. The Coastal Protection Act was passed in March 2019 to set out clear rules for Nova Scotia's 13,000 kilometres of coastline. The province is now working to develop regulations and is consulting on the ideas that will form those regulations. This legislation will help ensure future construction on our coastlines is built in safe places and avoids unnecessary damage to sensitive coastal ecosystems. Nova Scotia's coastline has many different coastal ecosystems and erosion risks, depending on the exposure to the ocean's waves, the shape of the shoreline and what the coastline is made of in different parts of the province. The documents under consultation set out the coastal protection zone and what requirements would need to be met to build in it. Anyone who wants to build in this zone would be required to hire a designated professional, such as a geoscientist, an engineer or a surveyor before they apply for a building permit. The designated professional would assess the erosion risk of the property and determine how far back from the shoreline construction must be. The Coastal Protection Act's regulations would also set rules for how far above the water construction needs to be.

\$6 Million in School Upgrades and Repairs

Schools across Nova Scotia will get additional repairs and upgrades to extend the lives of buildings and facilities, with \$6 million in funding from the province. Projects, which vary by region and school, include: energy efficiency improvements, including heating and green energy upgrades; new windows and repairs to building walls, foundations, roofs, windows and doors; enhancements to parking and transportation flow at schools and exterior and interior repairs, including new roofs, facade upgrades and painting. This funding covers 26 projects in all seven regional centres for education and Conseil scolaire acadien provincial. Some of the projects began last year and will be completed this year. Individual projects range in cost from about \$150,000 to \$500,000. These investments are in addition to the school upgrade funding announced recently, under the \$25 million COVID-19 Resilience Stream of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program. The province has also committed more than \$475 million between 2020 and 2025 for 23 new school construction projects.

African Nova Scotian Justice Institute Launched

The province is investing \$4.8 million in a new community-led justice institute that will support African Nova Scotians in contact with the law and help address overrepresentation and anti-Black racism in the justice system. The establishment of the institute, one of the first of its kind in Atlantic Canada, will be led by the African Nova Scotian Decade for People of African Descent Coalition. It will provide eight justice-related support, research and outreach programs, including: units dealing with race and cultural assessments & treatment services; a data collection and policing accountability unit; an African Nova Scotian court support program; a community justice legal defence program; a bail alternative, incarceration support and reintegration program for African Nova Scotians; an alternative justice and victim services program; public legal education and youth development program and human rights and policing accountability programming. The program funding will allow the institute to be fully staffed and begin offering programs and services within a year.
