


Gordon McCully, from Debert, to received his 30 year Legion Membership Pin, presented by Honours and Awards Chair Comrade Dave MacPhee. Comrade McCully was a Founding Member and the second president of Debert Legion before returning to serve his country again in the RCAF, he became a member again upon his return to Debert. He was attached to 424 Tiger Sqn. and at first stationed at Skiptonon-Swale England and later they moved to Ceylon (now Sri Lanka). He flew 30 missions over Europe, the Middle East - Iraq and Iran - and **India during his Wartime Service.**
