When the recent vandalism was discovered it blew us away. So much effort and planning had gone into the restoration of the quaint old former schoolhouse and we were so proud of it. People are attached to that building and it is lovingly referred to as "the school". There is a very strong sentimentality for it that has been passed down through the generations. We have all celebrated milestones of our lives there.

parties, wakes, dances, dinners, and even fundraisers that have raised thousands of dollars for families and people in need in the area. This is where our precious Londonderry Days were always held.

Who would do this??? None of it made sense. So life threw us lemons, what ya gonna do??? make lemonade! Winter was coming and things needed to be fixed.

Initially it was an impromptu phone call which started this campaign. Less than an hour after hearing the bad news good things were happening. Wilsons Gas Stops was the first on board with a donation of \$500 in gas vouchers, another phone call a few minutes later and Community Metals in Debert had committed to a \$500 gift certificate. That was enough for a raffle right there. A quick call to Ski Wentworth added a ski pass worth \$369 which got the momentum rolling even more.

The thrill and excitement of getting all of these generous donations soon outweighed the grief. It was overwhelming and very heart warming to find the businesses so willing and eager to help with this cause. Many of these companies, in fact most, did not have any connection to Londonderry whatsoever, some had no idea where it even was. They listened to the story, they were touched and they said YES!

Within two weeks we had over \$4000.00 in prizes, our lottery license applied for and hope that everything would be ok. There was an exhilaration, people were talking, people were volunteering, people were rallying...it was a wonderful feeling. The prize pool has now grown to over \$7000.00. The draw is set for January 6th at the Community Center.

To truly receive our happy ending we do still need to sell all of our tickets. 
