

Sunrise Senior Citizens Hosts a Meeting

The Sunrise Senior Citizens Northport hosted a meeting in Lower Shinimicas (Shinimicas means a "shining river" in the Mi'kmaq language) for the Cumberland County Seniors Council at its third meeting of the year. Meetings are held in March, May, September, and November.

The Northport Sunrise Seniors have their usual meetings at this former one-room school which has been renovated into a community centre. It has a stage with piano, an excellent PA system, and shelves for holding musical instruments. A list of charter members (dated June 16, 1977), two memorial plaques (of past members and of wedding anniversaries), a notice board, and a blackboard adorn the walls. At the back there is a fully equipped kitchen, a storage room, and a bathroom.

During the winter months, the Sunrise Seniors have musical afternoons, card games, dances, a pancake supper, an appreciation supper for volunteer musicians, and other meetings. This active club has as officers comprising the executive: President Arnold

Smith, Vice-President Arlene Goodwin, Secretary Barbara Slade, and Treasurer Beverley Mason. Entertainment began at 11 am with four musicians: Ronnie Smith, Linden (banjo), Hughie Hunter, Linden (guitar, piano, vocals), Bob Gimmitt, Amherst Head (mandolin, guitar, vocals), and Jess Thompson, Mount Pleasant (bass). These musicians get together to play music at the Northport Club and nursing homes in Pugwash and Amherst. Jess Thompson and Ronnie Smith also play at the Wentworth Sunday Music Afternoons, and Bob Gimmitt also plays with the Uniacke Ramblers.

After entertainment, everyone lined up for the noontime meal: beans, vegetable and fruit salads, meatballs, potato scallops, shepherds' pie, relishes, pickles, chili, biscuits, breads, carrot cake, lemon squares, chocolate squares, apple crisp, and ice-cream. As hosts, the Northport Sunrise Seniors sure know how to cook.
