Bethany MacKinnon Authors Poem

During the Remembrance Day service at Veterans Memorial Park, Ken Jamieson told the attendees of an exciting experience with Bethany MacKinnon, who was the 2017 summer students to work at the park. The following is a portion of his remarks.

We have been very fortunate over the last few years to qualify for a federal grant that lets us hire a student to help with the gardens of the park, and to maintain its looks, along with touring visitors along the paths.

One day this summer I was in the park and while talking to Bethany she told me how one day while weeding one of the paths at the rear of the

park suddenly a flurry of words came into her mind. Fearing she might forget them she ran over to her car and wrote the words down.

I asked her if she would show me her poem and with hesitation she sent them to me by email. I had to read the poem 3 times. First time I was surprised, 2nd time I was very honored, 3rd time I had tears. I asked if she would consider reading these words at our November 11th service, and also allow us to print the poem, as this is a usual format for our service program. Finally she agreed.

Bethany MacKinnon Recognized for Poem

Ken Jamieson continued his remarks about Bethany MacKinnon and the action he took after receiving her poem and what happened during the November 11th service, as follows:

I then sent the poem off to Chief Petty Officer (CPO) Ben Broome, N.S. Representative for the UN/NATO Veteran Support Group for his insight. We agreed Bethany should be rewarded for her beautiful and lifting words and CPO Broome would find something that was appropriate.

At the service CPO Broome asked if Bethany had her family attending as he thought it would be very nice to have her mother, Erin MacKinnon, pin the medal poppy on her daughter. CPO Broome's remarks included: "As serving members and veterans of Canada's military

we are very proud with what goes on with all branches of our service around the world; our younger generation seems to understand the sacrifices that military and their families make to ensure peace and security remains with us today".

CPO Broome also presented Bethany with a plaque containing her poem, while her mother, Erin MacKinnon pinned the metal poppy on her daughter.

At the end of the service Bethany asked if she would be able to have her "poem plaque" on display at future services, to which she agreed. Her mother, Erin, was taking the plaque to her school and teachers for them to see the beauty of her words.
