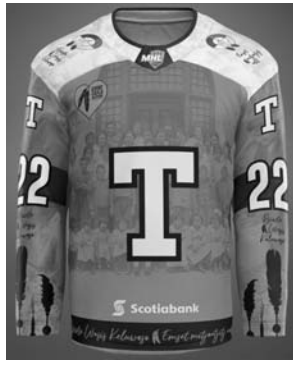


Truro Bearcats Hold Every Child Matters Night, Jersey Auction

37 Projects Approved for Beautification

Two Colchester Beautification and Streetscaping projects have been awarded \$50,000. Two Cumberland projects were awarded \$47,085, while East Hants project received \$15,000. They were part of a list of 28 projects in the Beautification and Streetscaping Program will share a total of \$582,592 to enhance the beauty of communities and attract more visitors to local areas.

At the same time, nine projects will receive \$164,083 through the Community Works Program. The provincial programs will help municipalities create beautiful, inviting spaces and provide opportunities for individuals to work within their communities, while the Community Works Program creates job opportunities for youth and unemployed people to gain skills and experience in their fields.

Quick Facts on the programs reveal both programs are application-based and fund up to 50 per cent of the costs of eligible municipal projects to a maximum of \$25,000.

In the local area, Successful Applicants and Project Information for the 2021 Beautification and Streetscaping Program include: Municipality of Colch-

ester, Fundy Discovery Site, \$25,000; Municipality of Colchester (Village of Tatamagouche Commission), Campbell's Marina Boat Slip, \$25,000; Municipality of Cumberland (Parrsboro & District Board of Trade), Beautify the Bay, \$25,000; Municipality of Cumberland (Ship's Company Theatre), Tidal Viewing Trail - Experience Amplification, \$22,085.

Town of Amherst (Amherst Chamber of Commerce), Gritty to Pretty Program will received \$25,000, while Municipality of East Hants, Elmsdale Village Core, was awarded \$15,000 for Detailed Concept Design and Report.

Under the 2021 Community Works Program 2021, the Municipality of the District of Colchester has been awarded \$17,270 for Debert Litter and Streetscape Improvement Project.
