Record-Breaking Season for Provincial Parks

For the second year in a row, Nova Scotia's provincial parks have broken their record for the highest number of camper nights. Camping parks hosted 99,304 paid overnight stays in 2022, an increase of nine per cent from 2021. About 1.5 million people visited camping and day-use parks, up by about 200,000 from last year.

The Department continued to make infrastructure improvements at both camping and day-use parks: an all-gender, accessible washroom opened at Dollar Lake; an accessible beach mat was added to Ellenwood Lake; lifeguard storage buildings were completed at Lawrencetown Beach and Clam Harbour Beach and water system and accessibility upgrades were made at several parks.

Park facilities closed for the season on October 10. There are no services and gates are closed at most parks. However, during the off-season, people can still use parks for activities like walking, snowshoeing and cross-country skiing. Visitors are asked to continue to follow park rules and pack in and pack out their waste.

Department staff continue to clean up parks that were hit hard by the hurricane. For everyone's safety, Nova Scotians should avoid the following parks until cleanup is complete: Mira River, Amherst Shore, Caribou-Munroes Island, Five Islands, Arisaig, Rushtons Beach, Melmerby Beach and Salt Springs.

This year, three more areas were approved to be provincial parks: Owls Head, Dunns Beach and Monks Head are currently in the formal designation process.

Funding for Transit Service Providers

To help offset fare revenue lost as people stayed home during the COVID-19 pandemic, the government is distributing \$10.9 million to transit service providers throughout the province. In total, 20 community transit operators and eight fixed route operators (e.g. Halifax Transit and Transit CBRM) will receive one-time funding to help make sure that Nova Scotia communities have safe, accessible and efficient public transit options.

Locally three of the 20 transit service providers receiving funding included: Colchester Transportation Cooperative Limited, \$68,233; Cumberland County Transportation Society, \$47,041 and East Hants Community Rider, \$65,882.

Cemetery Lots Available in Lower Onslow

Surrounded by the lush growth of Lower Onslow woods and offering a beautiful landscape of green grass and shrubs, the grounds of the Lower Onslow Clarke Cemetery are well kept to provide comfort, seclusion and a peaceful environment in which grieving loved ones and family members may remember and reflect on their Dearly Departed.

These 5 acres of hallowed ground have served loved ones and honoured the memories of individuals for generations. The cemetery was incorporated in 1984 on land generously donated by Kenneth and Marjorie Clarke, he a lifetimes resident of Lower Onslow.

The Lower Onslow Clarke Cemetery is owned and operated by the shareholders on a non-profit basis. Each person who purchases a cemetery lot becomes a shareholder. Each cemetery lot allows for one traditional burial or two cremations. Purchase is open to all regardless of religion or residency. Management is by a nine-member volunteer board com-

posed of volunteer shareholders. Grass cutting and annual maintenance is done by volunteers.

Cemetery lots can be purchased either now or at time of need. We strongly suggest you consider the purchase of a lot in advance of need as doing so relieves the grieving family of this task and secures the availability of a cemetery lot when needed. The current cost per lot is \$300. Please consider letting us help you settle one of those emotional decisions by providing you with a lot in the Lower Onslow Clarke Cemetery.

To meet our financial obligations, approximately \$1000-\$2000 is needed annually. For those wishing to purchase a lot and/or donate, please contact a Board Member listed below. An Income Tax receipt will be provided for donations of \$20 or more.
