Nova Scotia's minimum wage rate will rise to \$11.55 on April 1.The recommendations of the Minimum Wage Review Committee was accepted to increase the rate and update the calculation to set the rate for the next three years. The updated calculation is based on a 37-hour work week, the previous calculation was based on a 40-hour work week. The minimum wage is also expected to rise to about \$12.10 in April 2020 and \$12.65 in April 2021. Starting April 1, 2022, the rate will be adjusted annually with inflation.
