Family Pet Still Missing

It has been a very sad holiday season for a family in Masstown since their much-loved Annie, an 18-month-old boxer went missing. April White, says her family, especially her three young children have been devastated they have not been able to find her.

Annie was playing with her litter mate Lola, owned by April's parents in the back yard on Dec. 23rd and when they were called Lola came back, but Annie did not.

Family, friends and everyone who has heard about Annie has spent hours searching the woods, back yards and any barns or sheds where she could be hiding. Posters have been put up throughout the community and social media has been sharing her story far and wide.

There have been several false leads of similar breeds spotted throughout the province, but when followed up they were not Annie and there have been no actual confirmed sightings.

The fact she has not been seen anywhere has the family wondering if she may have been picked up, which prompted one Facebook follower to offer a \$1000 reward for her return, no questions asked.

Annie has a long tail and

was wearing a pink collar with tags when she went missing. She is a very friendly dog but once an animal is on the loose for so long, they can become very skittish and leery of people.

If anyone sees her, do not approach her but try to get a photo and contact her family at 902-890-5925. The family is also looking for closure if someone knows anything about what has happened to Annie.
