

The Wentworth Memorial Tree Lighting

The third annual Josie-Lynn Crawford memorial tree lighting at the Wentworth Learning Centre was a ceremony that stays in one's mind for long afterwards. When everyone came inside the Learning Centre, they gathered together to welcome the Christian holidays. Wee Wana Sprague took the children up to the stage to read them a story while sitting in a chair dedicated in Josie-Lynn's memory and then welcomed Santa and Mrs. Claus. Each child sat on Santa's knees and told him what they'd like for Christmas.
