O.B.F.B. 2010 RECAP

In May of 2010, the Brigade lost founding firefighter and Chief, Keith Hamilton. A large funeral was held at the Fire hall with members from all local brigades attending and some from other parts of the Maritime Provinces.

The total number of calls answered by the brigade for the year was 149. Of those 3 were structure fires and 3

vehicles. The estimated loss due to fires including structures and vehicles for the year 2010 was \$327,000. Our highest number of calls was medical at 68.

Next are motor vehicle collisions at 31, which have increased steadily over the past few years. Calls from neighboring fire brigades for mutual aid have dropped to 8. Brush and grass fires doubled at 12 calls.

Flue fires totaled 6 calls. There were 18 other miscellaneous calls ranging from false calls to poles on fire etc. Our largest fire of the year was a single-family home Belmont. At 3 am on Monday July 19 a dispatch was received for a structure fire at 100 Onslow Mountain Road.

22 resulted in an estimated loss of \$55,000. In August a new medical first response and forest fire response truck was put into service. The old Suburban response unit was sold to Economy Fire brigade for \$1.00. Our annual Harvest sale netted over \$17,000.
