The Colchester East Hants Hospice Society provides care and support to families facing end of life, through programs such as Volunteer Visiting, Food from the Heart, Practical Support, Hospice Wishes and Grief Support Services. They support the work of the District Palliative Care Program and are often alerted to special needs of individual families through the Palliative Care Program.

Vicki said she was looking

to the Hospice Society for advice on dealing with her emotions at Christmas time. "It is not going to be easy," she said. "I am planning on going to visit my daughter and grandchildren in Toronto for Christmas and will not come back until after New Year's." She is hoping a change of location will help her to cope a bit easier.

Wladyslaw (Laddy) Golemiec, of Belmont, placed an angel in memory of his wife Dr. Phyllis Golemiec who passed away iust two months ago. He says his wife was under Palliative Care for about a year and these services helped to keep her at home during her illness. "If we didn't have their support I don't know how we would have gotten through it. They were such a big help around the house and other support."

Laddy has been attending the Hospice Society's Grief Support Meetings Thursday's and finds it helpful to have someone else to talk with. "It is the worst thing when you are alone and have no one to talk to," says Laddy, "This is when you will think


People can visit the Angels
