Fast Fingers And Dedication, Helps Naugle Break World Record

The aroma of fresh evergreens filled the halls at the Douglas Street Recreation Centre on Nov. 24th and 25th as Carolann Naugle set out to beat a Guinness Book World Record for the most wreaths made in 24 hours.

She began tying the first branches at 4PM on Friday. The previous record was for 55 wreaths and Carolann surpassed this by 1:27AM, as she completed her 56th wreath. At this point, with exhaustion setting in, she decided it was time to give her fingers a break and curl up for a nap. "I guess my snoring woke me up at about 5AM," she laughs. "I made 6 more wreaths and by 6:05 a.m. I had run out of brush, so I had to take another break as I waited for more brush." It was estimated Carolann used about 600lbs of brush, cut over two days on her friend Ross Parks' land in Greenfield. She says it doesn't hurt the trees, "It is called tipping and actually encourages the trees to grow fuller."

This was Carolann's third attempt at a world record. Her first successful Guinees World Record took place in April, 2008 when she completed the World's Largest Wreath, measured at 76.77m. Her second attempt in 2010, for the longest natural garland, was completed but not recognized by Guinness.

On Saturday, by the end of the 24 hour period, the existing record was beaten by 15 wreaths, as Carolann completed a total of 70, the last one while blindfolded. "Someone once said they thought since I had made so many I could probably do it blindfolded, so I thought I should give it a try," she says.

All 70 wreaths were sold after the official records and pictures were completed. Carolann

planned on donating half of the proceeds, or \$700, to the Children's Wish Foundation (the other half would help cover the cost of supplies). A very generous lady, she has often helped with fund raising for the Truro Curling Club and was soon going to be helping special needs students at Brookfield Senior High learn to make wreaths.

Carolann didn't want to take all the credit for her World Record attempt, passing on her gratitude to Joan Huges, who helped organize the event and to her sister Gail Brown and friend Margo Mills, who helped cut and haul the brush. Ted Lohnes was the main witness and official time keeper for the 24hour time period but others stopped by to lend their support. "Two people had to be here at all times, so different people took shifts," says Carolann. "And I couldn't have done it without everyone."

The record was recorded on video, with photographs and a log booked was maintained. These items along with all newspaper reports and television footage will be sent into Guinness to verify the 24 hour record attempt.

So why try for another record? "I guess I enjoy the challenge and since I work at tying wreaths every year, I must really enjoy doing it," she chuckles and then adds, "And of course I love the smell!" It will be 4 to 6 weeks before Carolann finds out from Guinness if she will claim the World Record title, hopefully she will find out before Christmas but in the meantime there is more brush, more wreaths and more garlands waiting for her talented tying skills. Now that she knows she can do it blindfolded, maybe there is another record in the making.
