

## Remembrance Day in Wentworth Attracts Large Crowd

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, Remembrance Day was honoured at the Wentworth Cenotaph and later at 4 p.m. at a combined church service of the Wentworth United Church and the Wentworth Baptist Church congregations.

A large crowd, including members of the Wentworth Volunteer Fire Department, gathered at the Cenotaph and Faye Henderson, co-ordinator of the ceremony, introduced two young boys, Mitchell Baker (aged 9) and Max Baker (aged 7), who sang a beautiful rendition of O Canada.

Bob Hyslop read a text, asked for two minutes of silence in tribute, and played "Reveille" on his trumpet. Bob Smith, a member of the Royal Canadian Legion, read the poem "They Shall Not Grow Old." Rev. Dr. Waldo Grandy said a Prayer and ended with asking all present to say the Lord's Prayer.

Faye Henderson began the ceremony of the laying of the wreaths at the Wentworth Cenotaph. In total 25 wreaths were laid during the ceremony. Rev. Dr. Grandy said the Benediction and a Blessing for the noon meal. The ceremony ended with the singing of "God Save the Queen". The laying of poppies on the wreath or on the Cenotaph was completed and then most of the crowd crossed the road to the Wentworth Recreation Centre where the noon meal comprising sandwiches, salads, sweets, and drinks of hot

chocolate, tea, and coffee. Working in the kitchen were Jamie Alexander, Debbie Alexander, Mary Anne Jay, and Sheila MacNeil.

At 4 p.m. continuing the tribute to Remembrance Day, two church denominations, the Wentworth United Church and the Wentworth Baptist Church, combined to hold a service at the Baptist Church. Rev. Brian DeLong, United Church Minister, and Pastor Darryl Dykens, Baptist minister, shared the service. The choir included: Faye Henderson, Aubrey Giffin, Debbi Delong, Jean Wood, Peggy Patriquin, Florence Harnish, Bob Smith and Bob Hyslop. Members of the Wentworth Volunteer Fire Department who attended were Vernon Sprague, Joe Patriquin, Glen Rushton, Bill Baker, Arden Little, Todd Seymour, Norman Gower, Harold Smiley and Orland Carter.

Bob Smith read "The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier" and Pastor Darryl Dykens read "In Flanders Fields", two poems whose beauty and sentiments greatly enhanced the service. Bob Hyslop read a text, asked for two minutes of silence to honour those who served in the Canadian Armed Forces, and then played a superb interpretation of Reveille on his trumpet.

In his sermon, Rev. Brian DeLong, while acknowledging the sacrifices made by the Canadian Armed Forces during war, asked Christians to be prepared to work hard for peace.
