Chief Greg Muise gave his annual report. There were a total of 159 calls for the year with a total of \$107,000 in damages. This was comprised of 2 flu fires, 6 grass/brush fires, 84 medical calls, 19 miscellaneous, 9 mutual aid, 32 MVA, 1 structure fire and 6 vehicle fires.

There have been a total of 4913 calls since 1961, with a damage value of \$5,896,559.

Twenty-seven regular training nights were held, with a vehicle extrication practice at Maritime Auto Salvage. Several members completed courses at the Fire School. One member completed Level 1 Program and is in the process of Certification.

Twelve members completed SCBA Certification in May.

This year's Harvest Sale in September raised a record amount of money, and included the sale of the 1974 Chev 934 for \$8100.

Santa made his appearance at the end of the Banquet and handed out gifts to everyone in attendance. He had a special presentation for

MLA Karen Casey. A culvert at the front of the Fire Hall was recently caving in and MLA Casey assisted the Brigade to make sure the culvert was replaced and the driveway repaved.
