Committee accomplishments to date: Administered

provincial funds to eight Visitor Information Centres in Central Nova Scotia; Produced a series of "Top 10" rack cards highlighting local attractions in Truro and area, North Shore, Fundy Shore west and South Colchester; Developed a draft plan considering options for regional marketing and Contracted a part-time employee to market the region online, assist VIC's with information requests, and organize key events such as the two-week long Nova Scotia Wild Blueberry Festival.

Geoff Stewart, Colchester Councillor for District 3, has been chosen as Vice-President Union of Nova Scotia Municipalities (UNSM). His electoral district, primarily referred to as Brookfield is located south of the Town of Truro and north of the Town of Stewiacke along the 102 Highway and Route 2. He was first elected to council in 2012 and is serving his second term.
