It is with great sadness we share the news of our mother's passing on November 24, 2022 at the age of 94. Mum passed away of congestive heart failure, just 58 days after the passing of her husband (Gerrit) of 69 years. Mum was born in in Oosterbeek, The Netherlands in 1928 on a beautiful property that would later be a landing site for liberating Allied Paratroopers in World War II. Shortly after completing nursing school in 1953 mum arrived at Pier 21 in Halifax with her new husband and his family. Mum's early immigrant years were challenging as she learned a new language, customs and was quickly managing a household of six children. Nevertheless, she found time to contribute to the community as a member of the Masstown United Church UCW and Bass River Women's Institute. A woman of hard work and determination, mum was a willing partner supporting our visually impaired father's ventures and was frequently behind the wheel accumulating mileage rivalling a long haul trucker - whether for business or pulling RVs around North America. Mum also supported Dad by describing what he could not see in day-to-day life or during their shared love of travelling. Our mother was an exceptionally wonderful cook and entertainer. She could present a beautiful dinner with what looked like little effort. She loved recipes (which helped her learn English) and relished in finding new favourites such as a tourtiere recipe in Canadian Living Magazine that was soon incorporated into our family Christmas celebrations. As children, Mum always seemed to be ready at the end of a school day with a cup of tea and treat to listen to the day's event. As adults we are grateful she has passed on her soup-making secrets, and imparted her most quoted culinary tip being that "with enough butter or whip cream, you can make a stone taste good." Mum had the family's creativity. She was talented with sewing, knitting (especially for her grandchildren), needlepoint and tried her hand at woodworking, pottery and watercolours. Mum loved nature and especially flowers. Whether during the annual travels to & from Florida or at home in Nova Scotia, she revelled in the nature's seasonal delights. Always a lady, our six foot tall mum loved to wear dresses - preferably colourful ones. Mum completely loved her last 20 years with Dad at Folly Lake frequently referring to their serene life "On Golden Pond" as they enjoyed the loons, change of seasons plus many family visits & celebrations. Mum's greatest joy was family.
