FRONT PAGE BRIEFS **July 2010**

The Shoreline Journal is gaining high profile recognition within the Atlantic Community Newspaper Association, which represents 65 member community newspapers throughout Atlantic Canada. The recognition was part of the association's 38th annual conference, held in Halifax, May 28 and 29th. Tom MacLean, who joined the Shoreline Journal as a sales representative in April 2010 was recognized as the Top 2009 adAtlantic sales person of the year, for the second year in a row. Maurice Rees, publisher was presented with a certificate for being one of three standing finalists in the "Best Designed Advertisement". The ½ page ad for "That Dutchman's Farm", was published in the June 2009 edition and competed against over 40 other entires.

The Best of Colchester initiative organized by the Truro Chamber of Commerce generated a response of over 16,000 voting transactions as people voted for their selection from the list of nominees in the 25 selected categories. The Shoreline Journal, although not finishing as one of the three standing finalists in the Best Media category was elated to have been nominated. Maurice Rees, publisher, commented being nominated was a reflection of the improvements made in the publication since February 2008.

According to the Nova Scotia Association of Realtors, in the northern region, 17.4% more properties sold in the three month period of March through May, 2010 than in the corresponding period last year, up from 253 to 297 sales. In the same period the northern region delivered the second highest price increase when compared to other areas of the province. 2010 average price was \$117,199, up 3.5% over last year. Halifax-Dartmouth region lead the province showing the largest average price increase up to \$251,085, an increase of 4.75%. Provincially 16.2% more properties sold 3079 up from 2650 with an average price of \$209,893, up 4.6% over the previous year.

Dr. Noel Hurley has resigned as Superintendent of Schools/CEO, of the Chignecto-Central Regional School effective September 24, 2010. He was CEO for four years. His new role will be a professor at the Faculty of Education at Memorial University of Newfoundland. CCRSB is comprised of 17 Board members, over 3000 staff and 22,500 students throughout Colchester, Cumberland, East Hants and Pictou counties.
