Veteran's graves decorated in local cemeteries By Ken Kennedy

At a Legion "Church Parade" held at St. James United Church on Sunday, May 30, Branch 72 Royal Canadian Legion Great Village President Logan Spencer outlined the reason for their annual veteran's grave decoration day - or "Flag Day" as it is usually referred to.

'Each year around this time of year (end of May), Cobequid Branch #72 of the Royal Canadian Legion holds a church service in conjunction with Flag Day," Mr Spencer said. Church services are held on a rotational basis to include all the churches in the branch's coverage area from Glenholme to Lower Five Islands,

Flag Day is a day around which crosses adorned with a poppy and a Canadian Flag are placed on the graves of known war veterans and ex-military personnel resting in local cemeteries. There are over 500 veteran's graves in the respective cemeteries in the branch's coverage area, including Londonderry and Folly Mountain, Mr. Spencer said.

"For many years, Comrade Neil Morash made and maintained all those metal crosses," Mr Spencer said. This year new vinyl crosses made by member Ronald MacBurnie, Five Islands will replace the metal type. "Much thanks goes out to Neil and Ronnie for all their hard work and dedication." The new vinyl crosses should be more distinctive and require less maintenance, Mr. Spencer said.

As far as we know, Mr. Spencer said, they have all the veteran's graves accounted for. If anyone knows of a grave that may have been missed they are asked to contact a Legion member as soon as possible with the proper identification and location.

To assist local residents in determining if all veteran's graves have been identified, the Shoreline Journal is publishing a list of all known veteran's graves on a cemetery-bycemetery basis.
