ment spots, each club's entertainment session need not be longer than 15 or 20 minutes. Prizes will be handed out from draws. We hope to have a large crowd at the picnic.

By now the deadlines for applying for the federal grant New Horizons for Seniors Program and the provincial grant Positive Aging Program Funding have passed, but they will be coming again in the future. In September 2011, the 50+ Games will be held in Kings County.

Two major reports were given.

#1. The spring Convention of the Federation of Senior

Citizens and Pensioners of Nova Scotia was held in Truro. Most clubs belong to the Federation, which is concerned about seniors' issues that are taken to the Nova Scotia government each autumn. Clubs can send in resolutions about seniors' concerns before the Convention happens and then at the Convention the resolutions are voted on and if passed are taken to the government. The focus of the Convention's two-day meetings was the presentation of the resolutions, discussion about some of the resolutions, and then a vote was taken.

#2. The second report sum-

marized the Department of Seniors' Spring Consultation 2011, and topics mentioned were mental health, the new role of pharmacists in Nova Scotia, community updates, Department of Seniors' update, presentation of Intergenerational Awards, and emergency preparedness for seniors. In Cumberland County, Jocelyn Morris from Streets Ridge received an Intergeneration Award for being the director of the Cumberland Singers, a volunteer choir ranging in ages from six years to 84.

At the summer picnic in Wentworth, members may take any of their written sub-

missions for the Federation's autumn Newsletter and give them to Gertie Hollis, zone representative for Cumberland County clubs. She will send them all in to the Federation.

Several clubs reported on their events which included fund-raising, giving to charities, social concerns, and social activities such as card games, dancing, and making music.

The next Council meeting will be on Wednesday, September 21 from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Wallace Community Hall.
