
PHOTO FEATURE WCCS - The Wizard of Oz



Fire Brigades Will Benefit FROM NSP DONATIONS

Onslow Belmont Fire Brigade is the first in the County of Colchester to receive this generous donation but no doubt there will be more Brigades hoping to be a recipient in years to come.

Karen Saunders, NSP and Emera Community Relations Manager, came to OBFB Fire Hall on June 13th with a huge \$5000 cheque in hand, making the official presentation to OBFB Chief Greg Muise and Publicity Spokesperson Clair Peers. The cheque is just one of 36 similar donations Nova Scotia Power is making to volunteer fire brigades across the The donation Province. comes with an additional \$5000 in advertising support for the next six months.

Saunders says they plan to make donations to two volunteer brigades from each County this year, with plans to continue the program supporting additional brigades in the following years."There are 318 volunteer brigades in the Province, too many to reach in one year, but over the next few years we look forward to making many more donations, she says. "Safety is a priority in our communities, as it is in our business, too. Our employees often work in hazardous conditions, as do the volunteer fire fighters, and some of our employees are actually volunteer firefighters themselves. This donation will benefit all residents and take some pressure off these volunteers, who are already very

busy with their families and their jobs."

The donation comes with no strings attached. Each brigade is free to use the money where ever they see the need. Different communities have different ways of doing things and different needs," says Saunders, "They may need a specific piece of equipment, repairs to their roof or possibly more training for their members."

Chief Greg Muise was very pleased to receive the donation and expects the money will help Onslow Belmont Fire Brigade with an upgrade to their electrical wiring.

The additional \$5000 in advertising will be an added boost to brigades, as well. "We know there are important messages the fire brigades would like to send to their communities and this will help them to get these messages out," says Saunders. "We are looking forward to working with community newspapers, who have their own struggles and we are willing to help design the ad space, making it easier for everyone."

Publicity Spokesperson Clair Peers is excited for this advertising support. "There is only so much money in the budget for advertising. This will be a big help with projects such as membership drives and our annual Harvest Sale."

Volunteer Fire Brigades are encouraged to apply for future funding though the Nova Scotia Power website.
