

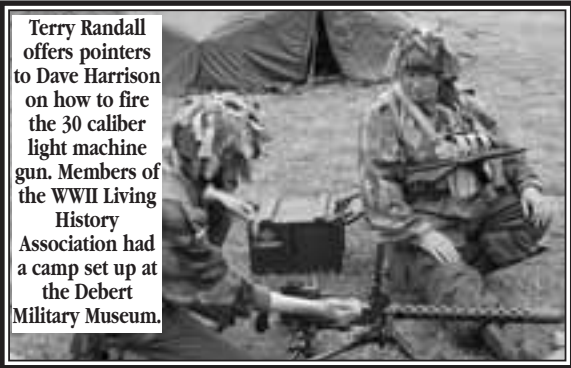

Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee

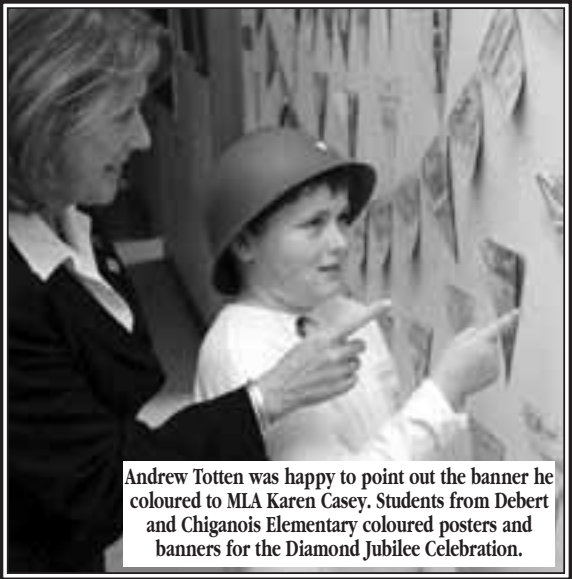

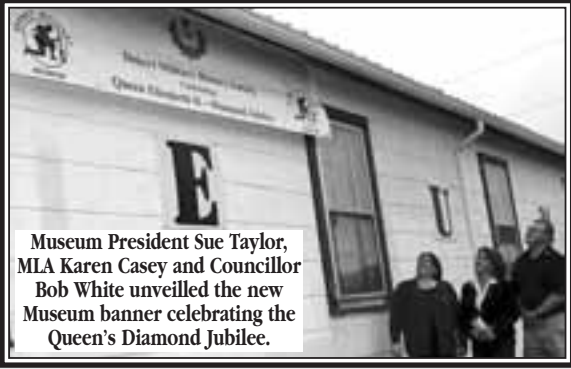
Noah Mills, the youngest member of the WWII Living History Association, gets a lesson on shoe shining from Harrison Irvine.



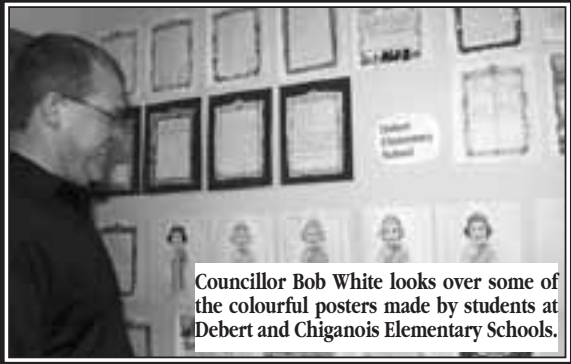
