## County Attractions Partner to Create "Loop" Brochure

The River Hebert Heritage Models Museum, Minudie Heritage Association and the Joggins Fossil Institute have a lot in common. They all work to attract tourists to Cumberland County, they all focus on the past - from 310 million years ago down to the late-twentieth century - and they are all situated on a driving/hiking/cycling "loop" which includes Highway #242, Main street, Joggins, the Lower Cove Road and the Barronsfield Road.

"With this brochure we encourage both locals and visi-

tors to travel the "loop" and take in the communities of River Hebert, Joggins, Lower Cove, Minudie and Barronsfield," says Minudie Association President, Sharon Gould. "This area has a rich history, in regards to both culture and nature and we want people to experience it all, not miss any of it."

The free brochure, available at the NS/NB Visitor Information Centre and other Cumberland County locations, contains a map which leads visitors around the "loop" and identifies eighteen heritage attractions to take in along the

way, including the anchor sites of the Heritage Models Museum, Joggins Fossil Centre, UNESCO World Heritage Site and Minudie School Museum and two churches. Local businesses are also listed for the visitors' convenience.
