

Age of Sail Alters Operations

Nova Scotia's 2020 tourism season has been devastated as a result of CoVid-19 pandemic, which essentially shut the province down starting in March. Premier McNeil and Dr Strang have consistently informed residents about what was being done and what people needed to do to slow down the virus to a manageable level.

In late June the restrictions were being eased and on June 3rd, provincial borders will be re-opened for travel within the Atlantic region. Borders for residents from other provinces, USA and foreign countries are still closed and may open when spread of the pandemic reaches much lower levels.

Many tourism businesses

are slowly re-opening but have had to change their operations. Most larger antique shops are still closed, but smaller "mom and pop" operations are open. Social distancing and wearing of masks when social distancing is not possible are strongly requested and will be enforced by regulators.

Due to the challenges of 2020, the Age of Sail has altered their operations for this season. The Age of Sail Museum is now open by appointment for tours Tuesday through Saturday 9:30-5:30 and the Cafe for take-out only will be open at the same time. In accordance with Dept of Health regulations dates and times may be subject to change. These measures will permit social

distancing requirements; control numbers and most importantly allow the staff adequate time to properly clean and disinfect high touch areas. For additional information call 902-348-2030.
